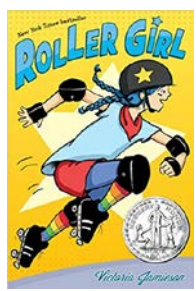

(Grades 5-8)

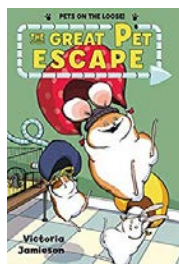

(Grades 2-5)

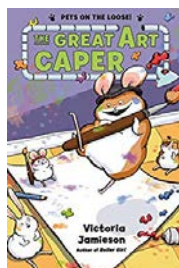

(Grades 1-3)

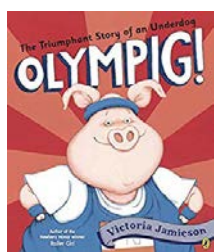
